

NPU-T Meeting Minutes
Wednesday, April 9, 2008

The General meeting was called to order at 7:32 pm EST by Chairman Kwabena Nkromo

1) Invocation

The invocation was presented by Sister Deborah Williams from Redeemed Community Outreach.

2) Approval of Agenda –

A motion was made by Oni Holley to accept the agenda as modified with this was seconded by Jerry ‘Tacuma’ Brown

3) Approval of Minutes – March

a) Copies of the March Minutes were distributed for approval.

(a) Major Perdue (Zone 4) spoke:

- (i) Major Perdue left copies of the crime statistics with the NPU-T Chair. He did highlight that business burglaries are down but home burglaries have increased.
- (ii) New officers are going to be added to both Zone 1 and Zone 4 for the purpose of foot patrol. They will be in place effective May 1.

(b) Ofc. Green (Zone 1) spoke.

- (i) Ofc. Green emphasized the importance of calling for suspicious activities.
- (ii) Copies of the crime statistics were left with the NPU-T Chair.

Community Projects

1.) NPU-T-wide neighborhood tire round-up

This was done last year and was very effective in cleaning up the excessive tires left in particular areas within the area. We are currently working on getting a tire dumpster placed at the West End Mall, so that items do not have to be taken to Turner Field. If we cannot get the dumpsters, the tires will be transported to Turner Field. We will need at least two pick-up trucks, to transport the tires from the neighborhoods to the dumpsters. Kwabena Nkromo, NPU-T Chairman, will be coordinating this project.

2.) Neighborhood Clean-ups

a.) The neighborhood associations within NPU-T will be nominating two sites within the area that need special attention, in terms of clean-up.

b.) A vote will take place at the next NPU-T meeting, April 9th, to determine the two neighborhoods we will focus on for clean-up. The neighborhoods chosen will be assessed by committee members, to determine what work will be done.

In general the work will involve litter pick-up and minor pruning of overgrown areas.

c.) On Earth Day we will meet in The Mall West End parking lot (Oak Street side), at 8:45am for volunteer sign-up, opening remarks and assignment distribution. We will split the volunteers into two groups and assign them their particular neighborhood. A coordinator for both neighborhoods will be chosen from the Beautification Committee or any willing volunteer, to monitor the supplies, clean-up and workforce. We will carpool to these locations, as to not inundate the neighborhoods with additional cars. We would like for everyone to be at their clean-up location by 9:30am.

RE: Monthly Report

This is a brief report highlighting some of the events and activities taken place over the course of March 2008.

Education Committee: Bakeeba Hampton (Chair), Omorede Booth (West End Resident), Mtisha Wilson (CAU Student), Rashida Chitunda (West End Resident), Dothlyn Bennet (West End Resident), Ayana Pines (West End Learning Center) and Mitizi Martelly (West End Resident)

Sub Committee Asset Mapping: Omorede Booth (Chair), Mtisha Wilson & Rashida Chitunda

Old Business:

The asset mapping sub-committee had its training on March 18, 2008 with members from The Community Foundation for Greater Atlanta, Khaatim El (School Board Member) and Chairman Nkromo. This training was beneficial in getting the process rolling to conduct an asset mapping for Youth services within NPU-T. The Sub-Committee meets weekly on Mondays to compare, contrast and map the information collected. The process will end on April 29, 2008 to be made available at the May 2008 NPU –T meeting.

New Business:

- a. The Community Affairs Officer from The Atlanta Public Schools will come to our next Education Committee meeting to discuss how the Atlanta Public Schools plans to work alongside the Neighborhood Planning Units to ensure that we are abreast of APS initiatives and issues pertaining to our neighborhood schools. The APS representatives from the various departments would attend the meeting as well to respond to specific questions or concerns in NPU –T. The manager would also send out information related to curricula, initiatives, technology and other pertinent information on a quarterly basis.
In conducting my report at the April meeting I will ask citizens if they have specific questions, problems etc. that needs addressing to present when the group comes to meet with us.
- b. The education Committee met with representatives from the Kindezi School (Dean Giles and Pastor Hill) to hear and ask questions, and to tour the site where the school would be located. The School would be located inside the West Hunter Street Church. The grades are K-8, with a class size of six students. The total number of students to occupy site are 216 and the school district is Southwest Atlanta; meaning that students who stay within the southwest Atlanta areas would be included in this population of students. The Kindezi School background information includes the culmination of a charter school in Southwest Atlanta which joins APS commitment to “raising the floor and taking off the ceiling” The school inspiration came from the practices of Bantu African community where the word Kindezi

was taken from –meaning taking responsibility for the protection, tutorial and holistic development of the communities children. The practices are as follows;

- i. Differences between children are normal and valuable.
- ii. Tutor children directly but also allow space for guided investigation and exploration of the real world.
- iii. Positive strong relationships are vital between tutor, parent, child and the entire community.
- iv. Teach children through the arts.
- v. Teach democracy by practicing it as adults.
 1. **School Vision**, expresses by the name “Kindezi” is a community of teachers and parents sharing the responsibility, privilege, and joy of holistically educating each and every child, preparing them thoroughly for creating success in all facets of life.
 2. **Mission**, based on the belief that all children are highly capable, intrinsically curious and fundamentally good, is to create a nurturing, empowering, and safe small class/small school environment. By design, we will provide Socratic tutorial, arts integration, and project based learning to further each child’s creative, cognitive, socio-emotional, and physical potential while instilling in each a love of learning and pride in accomplishment.

The committee supports the proposal and offers Kindezi our best wishes. We strongly believe that all children deserve an excellent education and welcome the Kindezi model to the area. As Education Committee Chair, I would like to express our commitment to assist Kindezi School in its efforts to establish a school for the communities of Southwest Atlanta. We face many challenges and we believe that a solid education is one piece of the puzzle that would help build up and strengthen our community.
